5. RACE SPECIFIC REGULATIONS

ARTICLE 1. GENERAL RULES

1.1. The 2019 UEC MTB Beach Race European Championships will be organized on the 15th December 2019.

The technical preparation and coordination will be done by:

Technical director: ProLiveSport - FONTAINE Guillaume

1.2. The event will be organized in accordance with rules of the Union Cycliste Internationale (UCI) and these rules will be the reference for everything that is not mentioned in the current document.

ARTICLE 2. TYPE OF THE EVENT

2.1. The 2019 UEC MTB Beach race European Championships are held for the hereafter categories and disciplines (with a valid UCI licence and concerning the Masters no daily licence authorised):

Men Elite Women Elite Men Masters 40+ (unique category) Women Masters 40+ (unique category)

2.3. the event has been registered on the UCI calendar.

ARTICLE 4. COMPETITION RULES

4.1 Starting positions

Because beach racing is a new sport all competing countries are mixed.

First rider the current European Champions.

After National champions

After Ranking of European championship 2018







- 4.2 Body numbers of the participants must be visible at all times. It's not allowed to cut off the number plate or wrap it around.
- 4.3 Participants are required to wear a hard shell helmet.
- 4.4 Participants are not allowed to be pulled by another participant or vehicle. Also drafting behind cars or motors is not allowed.
- 4.5 The participants are expected to know the course as well as the signs.
- 4.6 The organization is not liable for the participants getting lost.
- 4.7 The front and rear wheel can be no bigger than 29 inches, according to the regulations of the UCI.
- 4.8 Participants who misbehave, do not comply with the LOC regulations, or do not follow directions from the police and/or the organization, can be excluded from the race.
- 4.9 Participants have to follow the instructions of the lifeguards and the organization without delay.







- 4.10 The organization is in no way liable for accidents or damage or loss and/or theft of personal items and sport equipment.
- 4.11 Participants have to respect other beach users, nature, and the environment.
- 4.12 Riders ages shall be defined according to the UCI Regulations.

 The age of a rider shall be determined by the difference between the year of the event and the year of birth of the rider.

ARTICLE 5. TECHNICAL RULES

General

The riders have to compete using Mountain bikes.

Frame

All frame sizes are allowed in accordance with the UCI rules

Front Fork

A fixed and front suspension fork is allowed.

Brakes

Rim and disc brakes are allowed.

Wheels and Tires

Only 26-29 inch wheels are allowed.
Carbon wheels are allowed in accordance with the UCI rules

Handlebar

Aero-bars and attachments <u>are not</u> allowed. Cyclocross or road race handlebars <u>are not</u> allowed. Beach race handlebars are allowed

ARTICLE 6. AWARDS CEREMONIES

In accordance with the UCI Regulations, the 3 best riders of each category must attend the official awards ceremony, any interviews organized and the press conference.

Riders shall appear at official ceremonies wearing their national jersey or team/club jersey and shall not wear a helmet, a cap, a headband or glasses until they leave the podium ceremony area.

Riders must present themselves at the podium at 13h50.

Awards ceremonies at 14h00.

ARTICLE 7. AWARDS AND PRIZE MONEY

ARTICLE 8. ANTIDOPING

The anti-doping controls may be organized under the responsibility of the Cycling Anti-Doping Foundation (CADF) and / or the National Antidoping Agency of France.

The UCI antidoping regulations are entirely applicable to the event.

The antidoping tests will take place at **Office du Tourisme**, **proximity finish line**

ARTICLE 9. PENALTIES

The UCI penalty scale is the only one applicable.

ARTICLE 10. RESPONSIBILITIES

The organizers and UEC will not, under any circumstances, be liable to any accidents or damage that occurs during training and competitions.

The organizers and UEC decline all responsibilities towards the riders and others in case of an accident.

ARTICLE 11. Unforeseen

For all cases not covered by these specific regulations, the UCI rules will apply. Any issues and problems will be solved between the organizers, the Commissaires Panel and UEC officials.
