Dear Presidents, Dear UEC Management Board Members,

I am writing to inform you that I would like to officially submit my application for the Presidency of the Union Européenne de Cyclisme for the next four years, 2021-2025.

The last eight years of my professional career have been devoted to UEC activities, of which I have been General Secretary since 2013, a position which I obtained after extensive and constructive experience in the world of cycling.

After completing a training programme in Economics and Commerce with Swiss banks in Lausanne and Geneva, I undertook various work experiences in the UK, Germany and Italy, before joining the Union Cycliste Internationale in 1998, presided by Hein Verbruggen, as Anti-Doping Commission Co-ordinator until 2000 and Track Co-ordinator in 2001.

I left Switzerland for Italy and from 2002 to 2013 I occupied the post of Track Co-ordinator for the Italian Cycling Federation, in which I managed logistics for Track and Road national teams and major international events: 2004 Athens Olympic Games, Beijing 2008 and London 2012, as well as the World Championships and World Cup events.

As Member (2005-2009) then President (2009-2013) of the UEC Track Commission and Member (2009-2013) of the UCI Track Commission, I gained first hand experience of a constantly growing discipline with great potential, and put my heart and soul into helping it develop, until I was appointed as General Secretary.

During this time, thanks to the determination of Presidents David Lappartient and Rocco Cattaneo their respective Management Boards members, we followed a road map of major development which gave the UEC a new modern and organised image, that has enabled us today to become one of the most important and recognised organisations in the European sport's world.

Our attention has always been focused on the grassroots activities of our 50 affiliated National Federations, our athletes, and especially young people. We drew up and implemented a development plan that included, among others, the creation of new events, the introduction of the Elite Road and cyclo-cross European title, a multi-year contract with certain partners and Eurovision, as well as the strengthening of our close relationship with the Union Cycliste Internationale, European Olympic Committee and National Federations.

In the historic situation that we are currently experiencing, I subsequently decided that I would make a commitment to try and continue the work undertaken by the UEC over the last ten years in order to carry out the various projects that are still in the pipeline, especially those for young people, invaluable representatives of the future, so that they have the opportunity to experience our sport with passion.
