Dear Mr. President, collegues and bicycle community,

We are not yet personally acquainted with many of you, but I hope that soon we will definitely meet.

For the upcoming elections, I have mustered up the courage to ask for your support, given the enormous responsibility that comes from being a member of the executive committee and European delegate to the DRO elections.

I am doing this, first of all, for the sake of the opportunity to publicly, at all levels, fight for the future of European cycling.

My motives are simple: being the most ordinary boy, starting to cycle, cycling became for me a school, a university, a place to make friends, learn lessons of life, learn to accept defeat with dignity and strive for victories. Gradually, cycling became an integral part of my life, and today it has become its meaning.

Having headed the National Federation of cycling in 2018, my team and I faced exactly the same problems as many of you.

We were not heard or hear, did not perceive and are not taken seriously in our own country: neither the relevant ministries, nor sponsors, nor the mayor's office, nor the police, no one who could support the development of cycling in the country. Wall. Each step has cost and still costs us tremendous effort.

We need to be absolutely clear about and accept the work of the Federation today, namely, knocking on doors until they are opened.

Given my personal experience as an athlete and experience in the Federation, I definitely clearly see the goals and objectives of the European Cycling Union and know the ways to achieve them:

- Help National Federations build bridges with the leadership of their countries.
- To assist National Federations with experience in legislative initiatives. It is no secret that in many of our countries there is no law on sponsorship or social and medical protection for athletes. There are also problems in the financial management regulations for federations. And this is just the tip of the iceberg.
- Create a flow of learning from strong developed countries towards younger developing countries where cycling also takes place.

- Struggle to create conditions for strengthening relations between neighboring countries in order to exchange experience, a competitive base and popularize cycling in general.
- To create conditions for general sports camps in the off-season by synchronizing the goals and financial plans of the Federations of neighboring countries.

It is necessary to strengthen cycling as a culture, as a way of life. Cycling is not just a part of life for riders. There is a huge demand for the creation of international platforms for the consolidation of experience, the development of the cycling structure, in general, the training of coaches, doctors, massage therapists, university teams, managers, amateurs and bicycle activists, as well as all other members of our huge community.

It is important to protect, maintain, strengthen the high level in Western Europe and give new impetus to the cycling in Eastern Europe, which it so badly needs.
