We cannot wait to welcome and host you for the European Championships Munich 2022.

The European Championships will be the biggest multi-sport event in Germany since the 1972 Summer Olympics. From 11 to 21 August 2022, European sport will be united as its best athletes compete for the highest accolade of their sport on the continent – the title of 'European Champion'. Along with Olympiapark at the heart of the event, the entire city will dress up for a glorious and unforgettable spectacle of sport and culture – a fitting way to celebrate a golden jubilee.

Following a successful premiere in Berlin and Glasgow in 2018, the sports programme has been revamped for the second edition of the European Championships, upping the number of medal decisions to 176 and adding to the diversity of the event. Munich 2022 combines nine Olympic sports 'under one roof' and appeals to a wide audience, with individual, ball and team sports all represented and gender equity across almost all disciplines.

Cycling will return as one of the crowd-pleasers, featuring the disciplines Road, Track, MTB Cross-Country, and BMX Freestyle Park. The venues in Munich will be complemented by the Individual Time Trial venue, Fürstentfeldbruck as well as the Elite Road Race starts, Murnau a. Staffelsee and Landsberg am Lech. The picturesque towns will provide an extra dose of Bavarian charm, with the lakes and mountains offering a scenic backdrop, as Europe's best road cyclists tackle the course to Munich.

With this road cycling bulletin, we present you a glimpse of what is to come in less than a year's time. In the meantime, our team will be working relentlessly in the wings to set the perfect stage for all participants and make the European Championships 2022 an overall experience to be remembered.

MUNICH – A MODERN CITY WITH TRADITION

The history of Munich is documented all the way back to 1158 when it was first mentioned as “forum apud Munichen”. The Old German name means “by the monks” and derives from the monks who ran a monastery at the place that was to become the Old Town of Munich. A monk is still depicted on the city’s coat of arms.

Today, the Bavarian state capital is the third-largest city in Germany – behind Berlin and Hamburg – and one of the most prosperous and fastest-growing cities in the country. It is consistently voted one of Germany’s most liveable cities, with various career opportunities, a low crime rate, a broad selection of leisure and recreational activities plus an efficient infrastructure ensuring a high quality of life.

A METROPOLIS WITH SMALL-TOWN CHARM

Munich has become a global household name in various sectors, be it art, science, technology, education, or sports. The city houses many world-known brands, such as BMW, Siemens, Allianz, or FC Bayern Munich. There is a broad range of culture to be found in the 47 theatres and 46 museums, including the renowned Pinakotheken and the world’s largest technology museum, Deutsches Museum.

Built on a human scale, with no building taller than the spires of the Cathedral Church of Our Lady, Munich does not feel as overwhelming as other cities of its scale. Various other factors add to the cosy vibe, from the city’s parks to Bavaria’s cordiality and famed beer culture. Did you know? While the Oktoberfest nowadays often pictures a cliché, it is deeply rooted in tradition. When Crown Prince Ludwig married Princess Therese of Saxony-Hildburghausen in

1810, the citizens of Munich were invited to attend the festivities held in front of the city gates, with horse races marking the close of the royal event.

GATEWAY TO THE ALPS

Besides its touristic attractions, Munich boasts numerous green areas, with the English Garden alone covering 375 hectares. The Eisbach wave at its southern edge is one of the most famous river surfing spots and used by surfers throughout the year. Over a length of 13.7 kilometres, the Isar winds its way through the city and offers additional recreational activities on its banks.

With its central European location and proximity to the Alps, Munich is the perfect destination for both city and nature lovers. The picturesque lakes and mountains are a short drive away and provide the perfect setting for a weekend getaway.

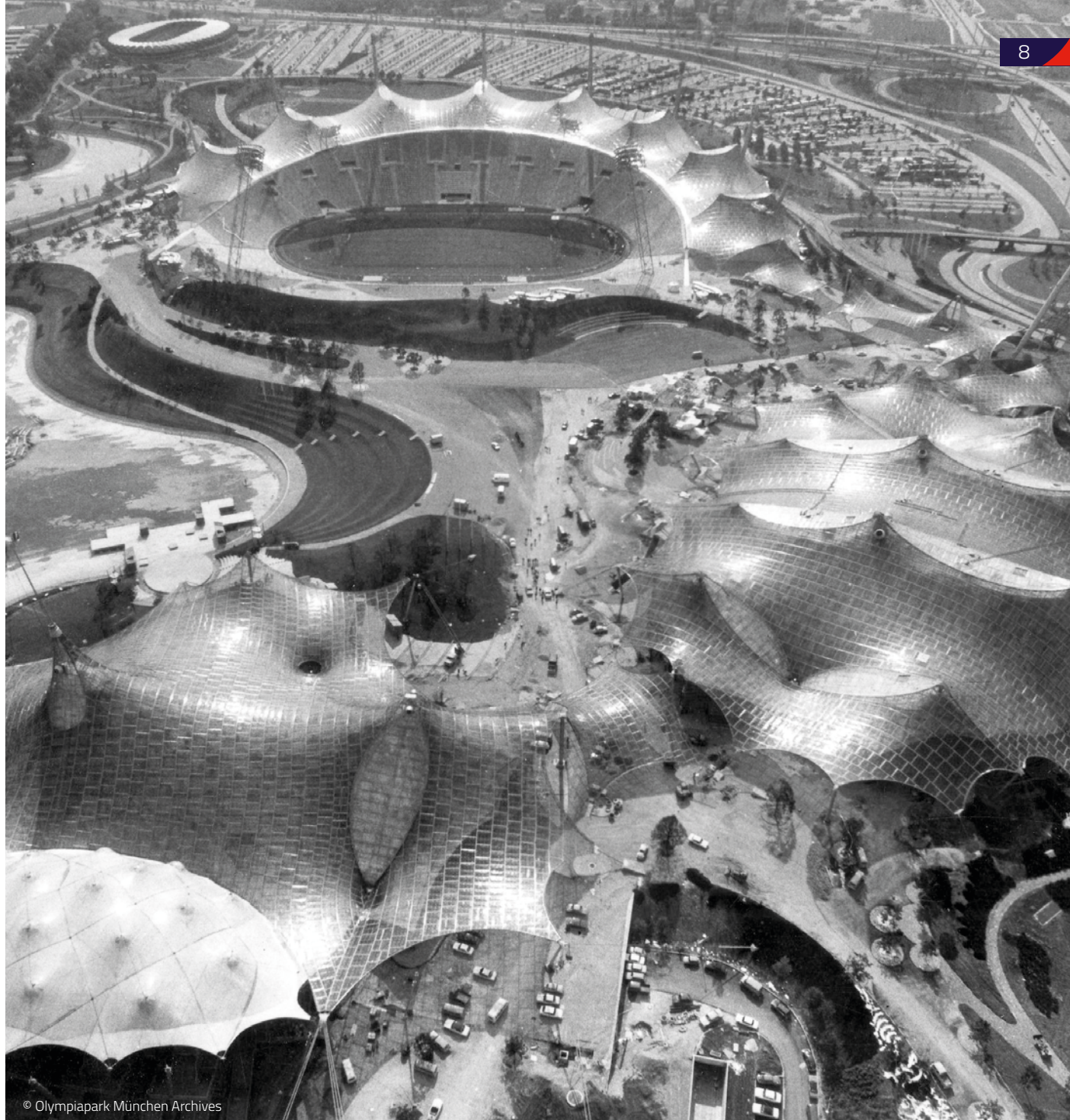

BACK TO THE ROOFS

Olympiapark München is an event location and meeting point with a glorious past, a vibrant present and a bright future. In August 2022, the park will once again be in the spotlight: By hosting the European Championships Munich 2022, Munich will welcome the biggest sporting event since the 1972 Summer Olympics. High-profile sports 'under one roof', right in the heart of the city, in a carefree atmosphere - such is the recipe for success for a unique and memorable experience. Back then, just as it is today.

Munich 2022 is an innovative return to the roots of the 1972 Olympic Games. A reminiscence of hospitality, happiness, and community, but also of the victims of the attack on the Israeli Olympic team. At the same time, the event is a concrete return to a unique and historic place. It is a return to the legendary architecture of Olympiapark with its world-famous tent roof construction, which once turned Munich, a village of a million people, into an international sports metropolis overnight.

Munich 2022 is more than just facts, figures, and sporting results. It is a holistic event experience, creating lasting memories in a light-hearted atmosphere. “The Roofs – Festival of Munich 2022” will significantly contribute to the eleven-day extravaganza. The festival of diversity and surprises will be accompanying the European Championships with a mix of music, culture, art, food and much more. It will turn Munich into the summer’s place to be, with plenty on offer for young and old alike.

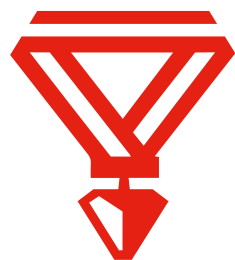
The programme is a tribute to 50 years of Olympiapark and symbolises the variety of this unique location, its history,

ROAD CYCLING VENUES

MURNAU A. STAFFELSEE

Located 70 kilometres south of Munich, Murnau a. Staffelsee will serve as the start for the Men's Elite Road Race. The market town originated in the 12th century around Murnau Castle and is situated on the edge of the Alps. With lake Staffelsee to its west and the striking mountain range to its south, Murnau a. Staffelsee could be considered a Bavarian cliché in the most positive sense. The cyclists will pass the stunning alpine landscape before tackling the final metres in the city centre of Munich.

LANDSBERG AM LECH

The Bavarian lakes and mountains offer a scenic backdrop and the perfect challenges to test Europe's leading road cyclists. The Women's Elite Road Race will start in Landsberg am Lech, a picturesque town located 65 kilometres west of Munich and 35 kilometres south of Augsburg. It is situated on the Romantic Road and noted for its historic centre. Landsberg used to be an important point on the Via Claudia Augusta, a Roman trade route which came up from Italy and headed towards Augsburg.

ODEONSPLATZ

Odeonsplatz is a must-see square in Munich's old town, surrounded by famous attractions such as Residenz, the baroque Theatinerkirche or Hofgarten. In 2022, the majestic lions of Feldherrenhalle will look on as the best riders cross the finish line. The athletics race-walking events as well as the marathon will also wind up at Odeonsplatz.



FÜRSTENFELDBRUCK

The Men's and Women's Individual Time Trial events will round off the road cycling discipline, taking place in Fürstentum. More precisely, the athletes will start and finish at the former abbey, one of the town's most renowned sites; the abbey church of the Assumption of the Virgin Mary is considered a masterpiece of the late Baroque in southern Germany. The venue has been partly transformed into a modern event forum, providing excellent premises for various events.

COMPETITION SCHEDULE

The 2022 UEC Road European Championships will run from 14 to 21 August 2022. The Men's Elite Road Race will take place on Sunday, 14 August, with the Women's Elite Road Race scheduled for Sunday, 21 August. The Men's and Women's Individual Time Trial events will be held on Wednesday, 17 August. The official start times will be published in due course on the websites uec.ch and munich2022.com.

MEDAL DECISIONS

Medals will be awarded in four events: Men's Elite Road Race, Women's Elite Road Race, Men's Individual Time Trial, and Women's Individual Time Trial.

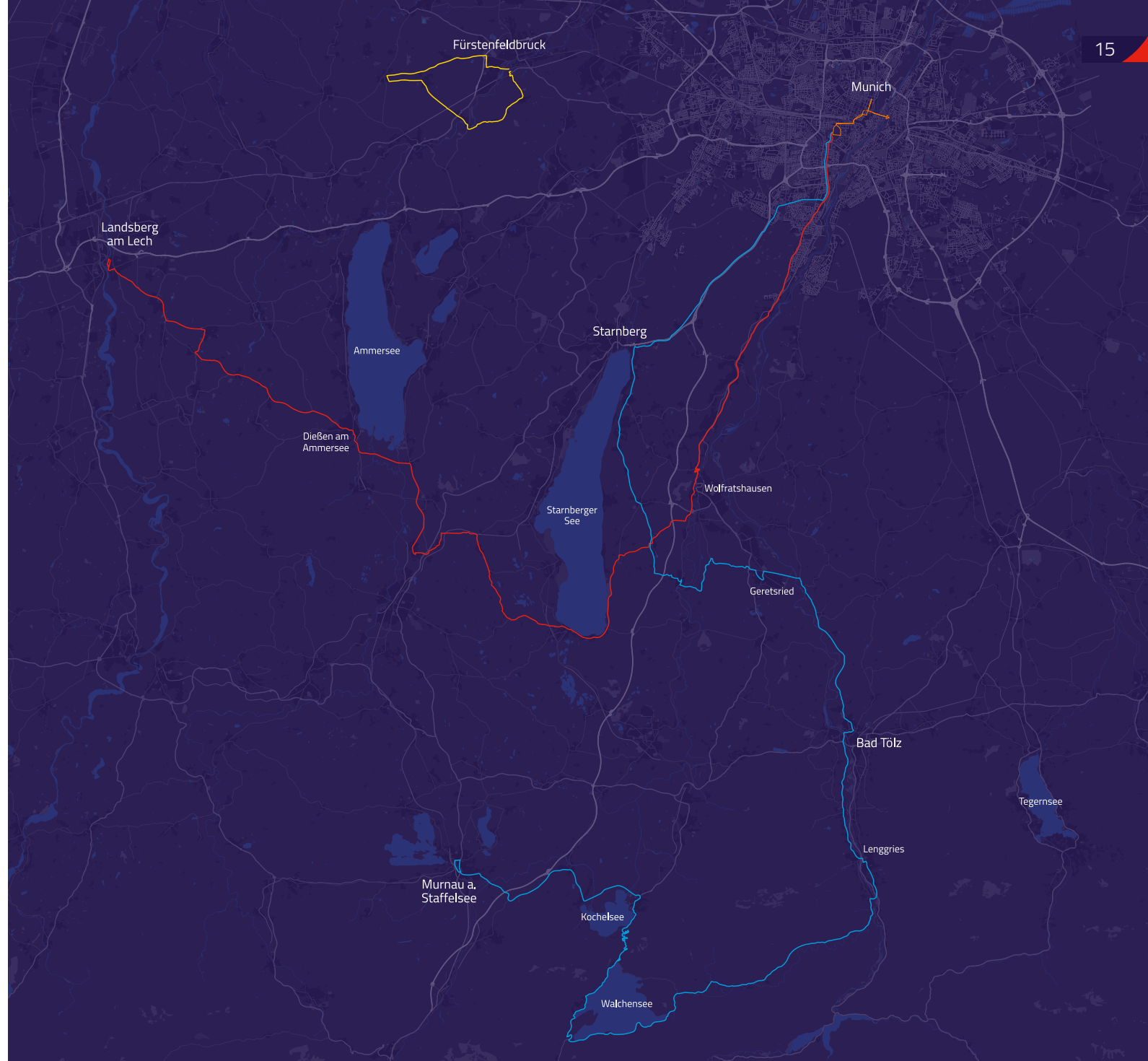

BOOKING PROCEDURE FOR TEAMS

Teams have to make their hotel bookings via the European Championships Event Management System (EMS). The accommodation portal will open in Q1 2022 and the teams will be provided with a link to enter the booking platform.

Accommodation should be booked as soon as possible to ensure a timely reservation. Once the online booking process has been completed, an invoice including payment notification is generated and sent by email. The

teams are requested to place their payment within 5 working days but not later than 01 May 2022 to secure the booking.

PLEASE NOTE: The booking will be guaranteed only after receipt of the full payment.

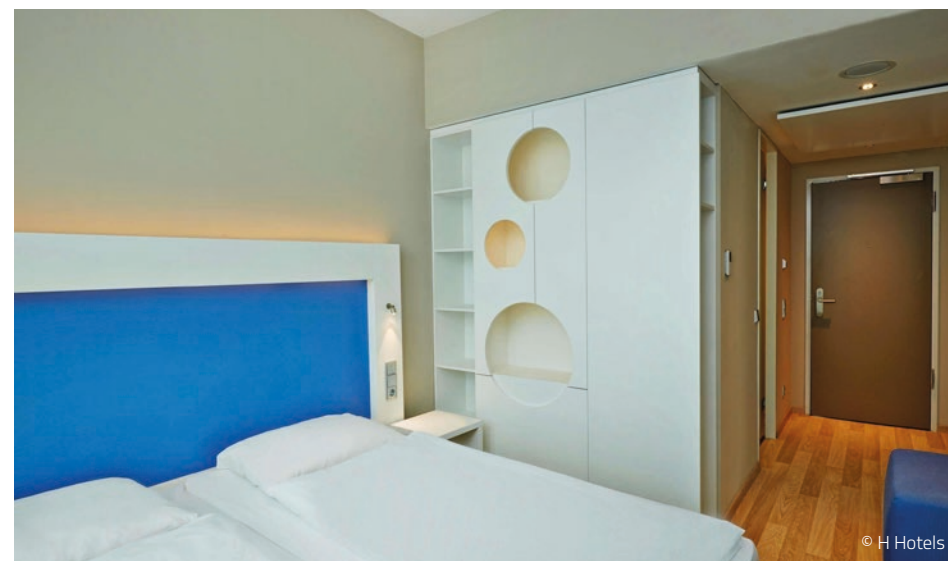

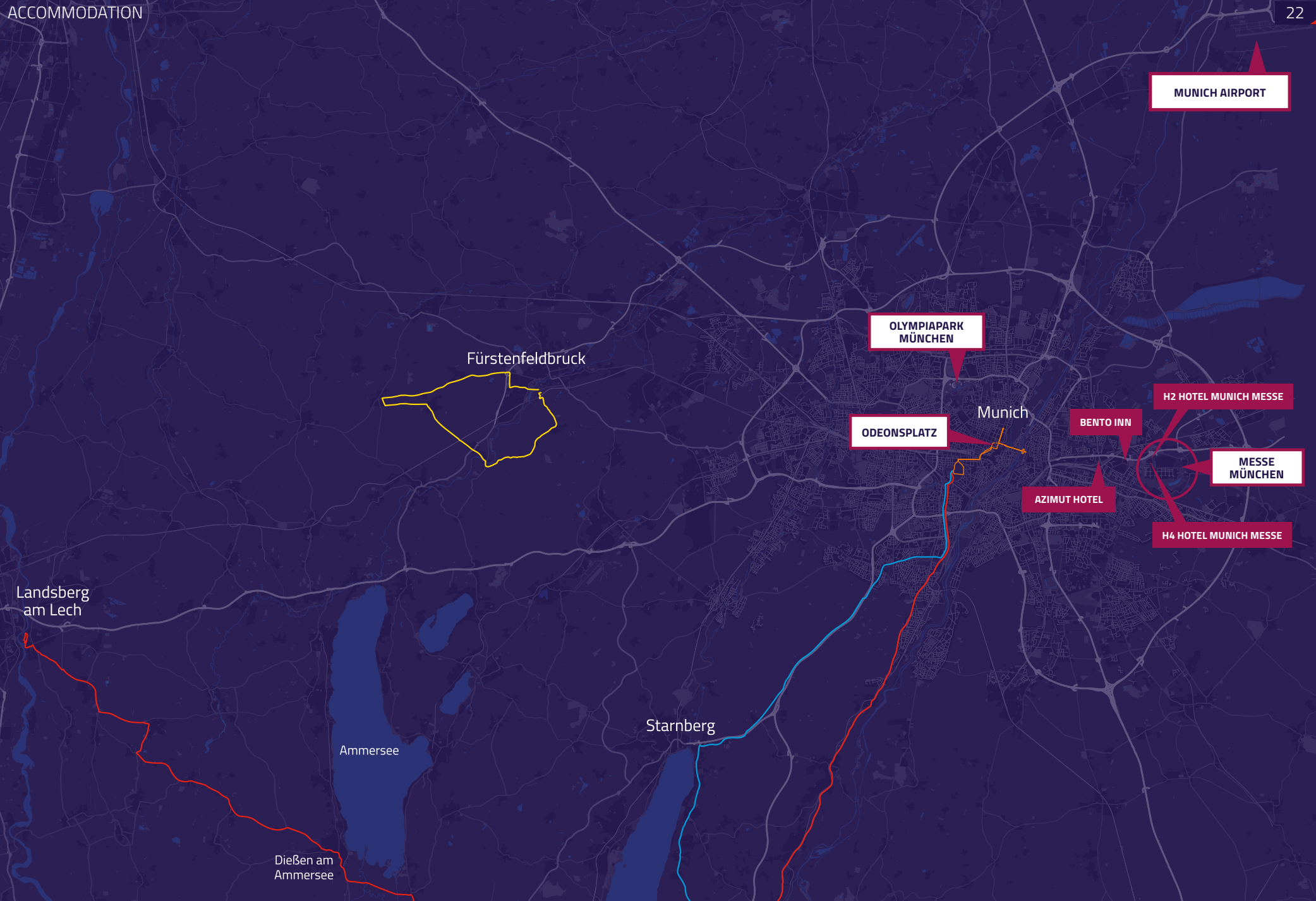

ARRIVALS AND DEPARTURES

All accredited teams, the UEC family and officials who book accommodation through the Munich 2022 LOC and adhere to the booking deadlines will be provided with transportation from Munich airport/main station to the hotel and vice versa, if required.

You will be provided with a link to our EMS to enter your arrival and departure details. The arrivals and departures portal will open in Q1 2022, the travel details deadline is 15 June 2022.

Munich International Airport Franz-Josef Strauss is located 32 kilometres (30-minute drive) and Munich Main Station is located 15 kilometres (30-minute drive) from Messe München.

ACCREDITATION AND PERMANENCE

TEAM ACCREDITATION

Munich 2022 will operate an accreditation system across all sports and all venues for the championships. All participants must be accredited for entering their competition venue. Registration for accreditation through the EMS is mandatory for all teams. The accreditation portal will open in Q1 2022, the accreditation deadline is 15 June 2022. The LOC will provide registration links to the teams.

Please note that the road and track cycling teams will be provided with their accreditation at the permanence at Messe München. Team managers are requested to collect the badges for their entire team and distribute them accordingly.

TEAM TICKETS

In the spirit of the multi-sport event, accredited athletes and team members will have the opportunity to attend events of all nine sports free of charge. Please note that the number of team tickets available depends on the capacity and occupancy of the venues.
