## REGULATIONS

The UEC European Championships Cycle Ball U23 will be played in a final event

- Date: In general 38. Calendar week of the year. The UEC European Championships Cycle Ball U23 can take place on one or two days, depending on the local conditions.
- Participants: All European federations can register one team. A-Group nations according to the result of the last World Championships, only can register players in the age group U23. In addition, players and teams of the age group (U19) can join. Teams from the B-Nations can take part with no age limit.

Furthermore, the host receives a "Wild Card", taking into account of the general participation rules. A supplement of the field, if less than 10 Teams registered, is possible. It will be done by UEC based on the latest result of the UEC European Championships Cycle Ball U 23. Therefore, we ask all Nations Group A, to register a second team. Nations, which ultimately take part with two teams, must submit a commissaire, otherwise they may lose a starting place.

With an increase in the number of nations, the UEC Commission may increase the participation rate up to 12 teams. In this case, the game mode will be changed accordingly.

**Mode:** Two preliminary round groups of five teams, sharing is done according to the result of the last European Championships.

First - and second place of each group will qualify for the half finals. The other teams have to play placement matches. If teams are equal on points: decision-according UCI rules **8.3.009** 

Preliminary round:	2 x 10 = 20 games
Placement games:	= 3 games
Half finals	= 2 games
Finals:	= 2 games
Total:	27 Games

For the order of play for the preliminary rounds, the UCI regulations apply. The UEC - Commission creates the schedule.

Additional Remarks

Over and above that, the UEC European Championships U23 are played under the current UCI regulations Cycle Ball.

All teams have to wear their national jerseys, except the World Champion, World Cup Leader or National Champions; the latter must bear the corresponding champion jerseys. Both players must have the same nationality.

Replacement teams or substitute players can participate for short-term loss of pre-nominated players or teams.

The chief commissaire is responsible for matches, division commissaires, result sheets, etc. The schedule will be done by UEC Commission.
