### 6. Event specific regulations

#### **Article 1. General Rules**

1.1 The Union European Cycling in cooperation with the Fédération Française de Cyclisme will hold the 2017 UEC Track Masters European Championships for the following disciplines. These championships may be contested by riders entered by their National Federation as a National Team or individual riders.

In all cases, the age of the competitor shall be determined by the actual age on the 35<sup>th</sup> of December of the current year.







- 1.3 Entries must be submitted by **August**, **29**<sup>th</sup> (riders, staff)
  Entrants for European Championships shall hold licences issued by a Federation affiliated to the UEC and have the nationality of the Federation doing the entry.
- 1.4 In order for an event to be considered as a European Championship at least 6 riders must be registered in the individual events and 5 teams representing at least 3 nations in the team events.

## **Article 2. Disciplines And Technical Regulations**

#### 2.1 Sprint

Distance: all ages will compete over 3 laps (750 metres)

The competition will be organised in two parts – 200m flying time trial (used for seeding purposes only) and sprint matches proper. All riders will qualify for the first round proper. The General principle shall be that every rider shall be beaten at least twice before elimination from the competition. The Commissaires shall organise heats and repechages to achieve this.

The Sprint Matches shall consist of preliminary rounds, repechages, semi-finals and finals as required.

The semi-finals and finals shall be decided by the best of 3 rides.

# 2.2 Individual pursuit

A qualification round shall be held to establish the four fastest riders in each category.

The two riders who record the fastest time in the qualifying round shall contest the match for 1st and 2nd places. The riders who record the next two fastest times shall contest the match for 3rd and 4th places.

# 2.3 Time Trial

Distance: Men 35 to 39 years: 1000 metres 40 to 44 years: 750 metres 45 to 49 years: 750 metres All other age groups: 500 metres

Women All ages groups: 500 metres







In all cases the Commissaires shall arrange two riders to take to the track at the same time whenever possible.

#### 2.4 Points race

Sprints: Sprints for points shall take place every 10 laps. Points awarded in the last sprint after the full distance will be doubled (10 points, 6 points, 4 points, 2 points).

**Heats:** When the number of entrants exceeds the maximum permitted by the regulations for a straight final, heats will be run on the day of the scheduled final.

#### 2.5 Scratch race

Heats will be run where necessary on the morning of the day of the scheduled final when the number of entrants exceeds the maximum permitted by the regulations for a straight final.

### 2.6 Team Sprint

The Team Sprint Championships will be organised for the following age categories.

Men Cat. 35-54

Cat. 55+

Women Cat. Open Any two riders of any age

Teams shall register riders of the same Nationality and all riders should wear the same jersey.

A qualification round shall be held to establish the four fastest teams in each category.

The two teams who record the fastest time in the qualifying round shall contest the match for 1st and 2nd places. The teams who record the next two fastest times shall contest the match for 3rd and 4th places.

#### 2.7 Team Pursuit

**Distance:** Men 3000 metres

The time will be taken on the third rider to complete the distance

Women 2000 metres

The time will be taken on the third rider to complete the distance

The Team Pursuit Championships will be organised for the following age categories.

Men Cat. 35-54

Cat. 55+

Women Cat. Open Any three riders of any age

Teams shall register riders of the same Nationality and all riders should wear the same jersey.

A qualification round shall be held to establish the four fastest teams in each category.

The two teams who record the fastest time in the qualifying round shall contest the match for 1st and 2nd places. The teams who record the next two fastest times shall contest the match for 3rd and 4th places.

# 2.8 Combining Championships

Championships are normally organised in age groups of five years: 35-39, 40-44, 45-49 etc.

Depending on the number of participants in each age group, these may be regrouped with an adjoining age group, in which case one single classification shall be drawn up.

There shall be no separate race for an age group if there are less than six participants in individual events or less than 5 teams representing at least 3 nations in teams events.







# 2.9 Entry eligibility

Individual entries will be accepted from riders within the Masters Age Categories with the following exceptions.

- Those who have competed in track competitions within World Championships, Olympic Games, Continental Games, Continental Championships, Regional Games, Commonwealth Games or World Cups in the previous season and the current year other than events for Masters
- Those members of a UCI registered team in the previous season and the current year.
- Is under suspension from the UCI or any National Federation affiliated to the UCI.

Please note – previous season relates to the UCI 2016-17 track season.

#### 2.10 Race clothing

All riders shall compete exclusively in the name of their Nation.

Riders may compete in their National jersey, club jersey or a plain jersey.

Riders have to wear the same jersey in the team events.

#### 2.11 Licences

All riders who compete in the UEC Track Masters European Championships shall be holders of an annual licence issued by a National Federation affiliated to the UCI that is endorsed for International Competition.

### 2.12 Entry fees

General Registration fee: € 50

Individual Events: € 30

Team Events: € 70 per team, which can be paid and entered any time up to 24 hours before the relevant event taking place. Anyone pre-entering a team may change the composition of the team up to the entry deadline.

Pre-Registration Closing Date: 27 August 2017

If entry registration is received after the pre-registration closing date or on the day of competition then a one off fee of € 30 may be charged in addition to the general registration fee. (Acceptance of any late registration will be conditional of space in relevant race/s being available.)

#### 2.13 Staff accreditation

Every member of the staff shall be holder of an annual licence issued by a National Federation affiliated to the UCI and be 18 years old or more.

Staff accreditations may be purchased which will allow access to the infield zone. The fee for this will be € 30 for the complete event. Helpers







#### 2.14 Commissaires' Pannel decisions

The decision of the panel of UCI Commissaires is final.

# 2.15 Victory Ceremony

The first three riders or teams placed in each Championship shall be available at the time required by the organisers for the Victory Ceremony.

The winner(s) of each Championship shall be awarded a European Masters Track Champion's jersey and a gold medal.

In addition the 2nd and 3rd placed riders shall receive a silver and bronze medal respectively.

The National Anthem of the Champions country shall be played during the Victory Ceremony.

### **Article 3. Antidoping**

The anti-doping controls may be run under the responsibility of the CADF or AFLD.

An official Communiqué will be distributed by the appointed DCO.

#### **Article 4. Penalties**

The UCI penalty scale is the only one applicable.

## Article 5. Responsibilities

The organizers, the FFC and UEC will not, under any circumstances, be liable to any accidents or damage that occurs during training and competitions.

The organizers, the FFC and UEC decline all responsibilities towards the riders and others in case of an accident.

For all cases not covered by these specific regulations, the UCI rules will apply. Any problems will be solved between the organizers, the Commissaires Panel, FFC and UEC officials.
