- To be allowed to proceed cumulative badge collection (for their delegation) at the Gold Accreditation Centre











OVERVIEW – NATIONAL FEDERATION & VISA

- Nominated a Chef de Mission: 191.
- Require a Visa to enter United Kingdom: 111.
- Tier 3 & 4 require a Visa to enter United Kingdom: 102.
- Only 42% of the NFs who need a UK Visa have requested a visa invitation to date (47/111 NFs).
- Only 331 Visa invitation letters were requested by 12 June by 47 NFs.
- Visa online invitation system was opened on 10 April 2023

UK Entry Visa- clarification on process and fees

1. Visa applications are made in 2 stages

- 1. online application form is completed and visa fee paid online
- 2. biometric appointment is booked online and biometrics have been taken at the visa application centre.
- ➤ If both stages have not been completed then that application is incomplete and will not be processed until both of the above stages have been completed.
- Only when the Delegates has had a Biometrics the application will be sent to The UKVI

Please note:

- Priority and Super priority services are not available at all the VAC application centres
- Priority and super Priority service fees must be paid online before biometrics are taken as the system does not allow to apply these services once the application is pushed to our UK Visa & Immigration Office system.


Reduce the level of harmful vehicle emission LEZ

1 June 2023

All vehicles entering the zone will need to met the emission standards

Plan ahead for the LEZ

Glasgow Low Emission Zone



- Low Emission Zones (LEZs) stop the most polluting vehicles entering an area, which improves air quality and helps to protect public health.
- LEZs operate 24 hours a day, seven days a week, all year round
- Automatic Number Plate Recognition (ANPR) cameras are linked to local and national vehicle licensing databases, to monitor all vehicles driving in a LEZ. They will detect vehicles which do not comply with the emission standards.

Glasgow Low Emission Zone - Emission Standards

Emission Standards

A vehicle may only drive within a LEZ if it meets the specified emission standards.

LEZ emission standards are specified with regards to the Euro emission standards, and are as follows:

- •Euro 4 for petrol cars and vans
- Euro 6 for diesel cars and vans
- •Euro VI for buses, coaches and HGVs

Motorbikes and mopeds are not included in the current LEZ schemes and no restrictions will apply. You can use this link <u>Vehicle Checker</u> (UK vehicles) to check to see if your vehicle can drive within a LEZ.

Penalty Charges

If a vehicle does not meet the specified emission standards, then the owner of that vehicle would be subject to a Penalty Charge Notice (PCN) should they drive it within a LEZ.

Glasgow Low Emission Zone - Quick Links

•See if your vehicle meets LEZ emission standards by using **Transport Scotland's vehicle registration checker**

- •Blue Badge holders who require exemptions can register their details on <u>Transport Scotland's LEZ exemption system</u>
- •Zone residents who require a grace period until 31 May 2024, can apply by clicking on this link
- •Public hire taxi operators applying for a time-limited (temporary) exemption can do so by clicking on this link
- •In exceptional circumstances, Glasgow's LEZ scheme will allow for time-limited (temporary) exemptions of up to one year. You can find out more and access the application process by clicking on this link

Customs - Travelling into the UK with equipment

- Due to Brexit and a change to UK Border controls, any equipment that is not personal kit, is subject to temporary import and return regulations.
- This applies to any new/unused equipment that you may be bringing with you to the UK.
- The approved way of temporary import and export (avoiding possible searches, imposition of tariffs and penalties) is an ATA Carnet.
- If you intend to bring items that will be sold or left in the UK, you will be liable for import tax and duty.

Customs - ATA Carnet

ATA Carnet

- Straightforward when you have the paperwork.
- With an ATA Carnet, you do not have to pay customs duty or tax.
- You are not considered as freight with a Carnet, travelling in a van.
- You will need an EORI number (European Operators Registration & Identification Number)
- You compile a list of all the non-personal items you are carrying, add them to the Carnet.
- On entry to the UK you must get the Carnet stamped by UK Customs
- On exiting the UK you must get the Carnet stamped again. The border staff may check the list but unlikely.

A Carnet can be organised in most countries, with local pricing. A 24 hour service is possible in some countries.

QUESTIONS ASKED IN ADVANCE

1. When / where will track equipment registration for the Paris 2024 Olympic Games be done?

Answer: This will be done at the velodrome (Emirates Arena). The location within the venue and times will be announced in the Technical Guide.

2. When will the accreditation quota for National Federations be confirmed for each World Championships included in the event? (Will there be allocation for multi-sport staff, or do we have to accredit individually for each sport?)

Answer: The accreditation quotas for each included World Championships will be confirmed in the technical guide for that Championships. In case a person filling a role such as a coach or mechanic will support multiple disciplines, it is possible to request access to multiple venue clusters for that person. Only a single application for each person needs to be made.

QUESTIONS ASKED IN ADVANCE

3. How will the number of wrist bands per National Federation for each session for Track be decided and when will this be confirmed?

Answer: The number of bracelets will be based on the number of accreditations for roles such as mechanics, physios, coaches, et cetera. Only staff and people required for the competition will be able to access the infield. Athletes not competing and staff not actively needed in the infield will be asked to go to the sports hall or in the stands (reserved section for teams). This information will be included in the Technical Guide on 23rd June (once World Championships Qualification has been finalised – the quota for each role depends on the World Championships quota earned).

4. Will Junior MTB Downhill riders be able to gain access to the downhill venue for the day of Elite finals competition with their accreditation?

Answer: Yes.

QUESTIONS ASKED IN ADVANCE

5. Is there a list of all MTB XCO and DHI staff accreditations that will be made available to view prior to accreditations opening?

Answer: Yes; this information will be published in the mountain bike technical guides.

6. How athlete registration for Indoor Cycling and Granfondo be done? In past years, athletes were able to register themselves.

Answer: For Indoor Cycling, the UCI Online Registration System will be used as is done with most other disciplines. For Gran Fondo, individual athletes still register themselves directly with the organisation. Registration for Gran Fondo is now open, and can be done here: <u>Gran Fondo | 2023 UCI Cycling World Championships (cyclingworldchamps.com)</u>

7. Can the UCI intervene with the UK Government to simplify the customs (temporary import) procedure?

Answer: Such a request was made to the UK Government by the organisers. However, we suggest that you engage a logistics company(broker) to help you with customs as it is the only guaranteed way to have full approval on the equipment you are shipping or transporting with you in the UK.
