2. GENERAL INFORMATION

2.1. TRAVEL AND ACCOMMODATION

Travel and accommodation expenses to and from La Molina (Spain) must be covered by the National Federations and teams.

Airports

Barcelona-El Prat Airport (BCN) – Approx. 2.5 to 3 hours by car or train.

Girona-Costa Brava Airport (GRO) – Approx. 2 to 2.5 hours by car.

Toulouse-Blagnac Airport (TLS), France – Approx. 3 to 3.5 hours by car (via Andorra)

Once you land:

From Barcelona or Girona, you can rent a car or take public transport (train or bus) to La Molina.

From Toulouse, renting a car is the most convenient option.

Trains

From Barcelona:

Take the R3 Rodalies line from Barcelona Sants, Plaça Catalunya, or Arc de Triomf stations.

The train goes directly to La Molina station (*Estació de La Molina*).

Duration: Around 3 hours.

Once at the station, there are taxis and some accommodations offer shuttle services to La Molina (approx. 3 km).

Car

From Barcelona (approx. 2 hours 15 minutes – 160 km):

Take the C-16 highway (E-9) toward Manresa / Berga / Túnel del Cadí.

After crossing the Túnel del Cadí (toll road), continue to Alp.

Follow signs to La Molina.

From Girona (approx. 2 hours – 130 km):

Take the C-66 and then N-260 toward Olot / Ripoll / Puigcerdà.

Continue through Alp and follow signs to La Molina.

All participants must hold a valid passport or identity card. Visa obligations must be respected.

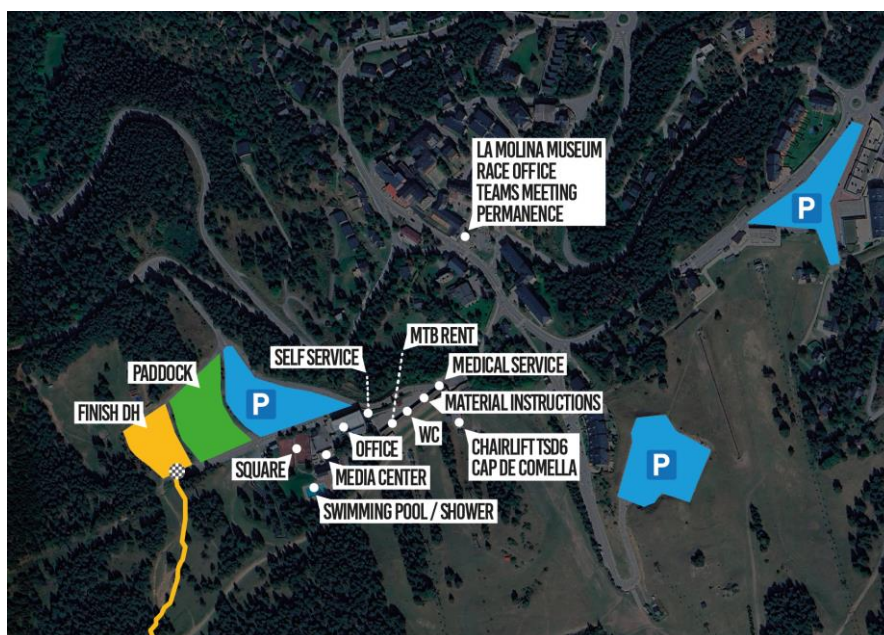

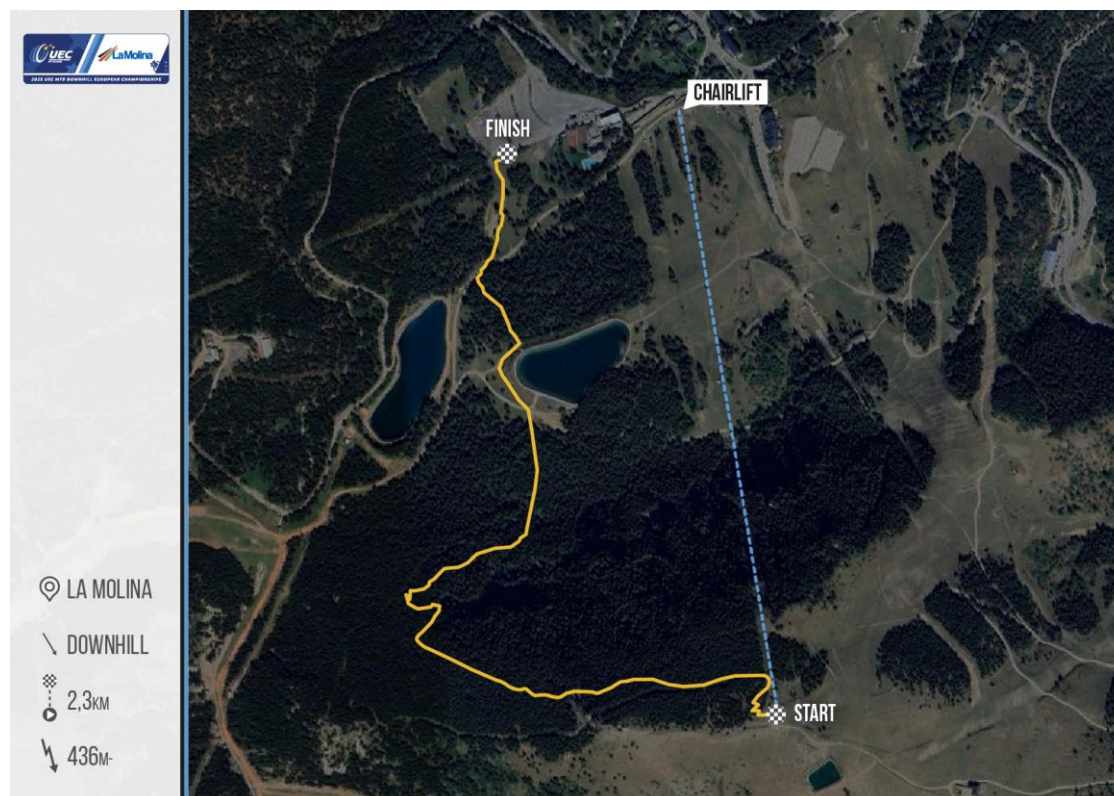

7. RACE SPECIFIC REGULATIONS

1. GENERAL RULES

- 1.1 The 2025 UEC MTB DHI European Championships are organised by the Union Européenne de Cyclisme (UEC) in cooperation with Association Bike Dents du Midi.

The technical preparation and coordination will be done by: TBC

Technical Directors: Giorgio BARUFFI (UEC) & Angel Aznar

- 1.2 The event will be organised in accordance with rules of the Union Cycliste Internationale (UCI) and these rules will be the reference for everything that is not mentioned in the current document.
- 1.3 The European MTB Championships consist of the following races: Downhill (DHI).

These Championships may be contested by riders entered by their National Federation as a National Team or by riders belonging to an official team.

2. TYPE OF THE EVENT

The participation is open for the following categories:

✓	U15	Men & Women	13-14 years old
✓	U17	Men & Women	15-16 years old
✓	Juniors	Men & Women	17-18 years old
✓	Elite	Men & Women	19+ years old
✓	Masters Men	35-39 / 40-44 / 45-49 / 50-54 / 55-59 / 60-64 / 65-69 / 70+	
✓	Masters Women	35-39 / 40-44 / 45-49 / 50-54 / 55-59 / 60-64 / 65+	

It is entered on the UCI calendar as a Continental Championships event (UCI CC).

3. PARTICIPATION

Participation – NATIONAL TEAMS

The participation is open for European riders only.

National Federations may enter the following riders free of charge:

- ✓ **Juniors: 3 Women & 3 Men**
- ✓ **Elite: 3 Women & 3 Men**

The National Federations have to register their teams (riders, staff and NF Official Delegates) directly on the UEC website <https://uec.evodata.it/landing/index.php>

Registration opening: *Wednesday, 28 May 2025 (12:00 CET)*

Registration deadline: *Thursday 24 July 2025 (23:59 CET)*

Riders must compete in their national jersey.

Participation – OTHER RIDERS

Participation is only open to athletes with European sporting nationality

UEC MTB DHI European Championships for the Mens Elite and Mens Junior are open to riders corresponding to one of the following categories and criteria:

A. MEN ELITE

1. Having obtained at least **20** UCI points in the UCI DHI individual reference ranking (*).
2. Riders belonging to a UCI World Series MTB Team or a UCI MTB Team;
3. Reigning National Champions in this category;
4. The National Federations may enter a maximum (in excess of the numbers listed at point 3.1 - Participations NATIONAL TEAM - and paying the entry fee) of **6** supplementary riders per category. These riders must wear national team clothing.

B. MEN JUNIOR

1. Having obtained at least **2** UCI points in the UCI DHI individual reference ranking (*).
2. Riders belonging to a UCI World Series MTB Team or a UCI MTB Team;
3. Reigning National Champions in this category;
4. The National Federations may enter a maximum (in excess of the numbers listed at point 3.1 - Participations NATIONAL TEAM - and paying the entry fee) of **8** supplementary riders per category. These riders must wear national team clothing.

(*) **The date of such reference rankings is fixed on 01 July 2025.**

The participation is open for European riders only.

- * 4.1.009 All riders aged 35 or over who hold a masters licence are allowed to ride mountain bike events on the UCI international masters calendar, apart from:
1. riders who, during the current season starting January 1st, have scored 1 or more UCI points during the same calendar year as a UCI masters event;
 2. riders who during the current year have been a member of a team registered with the UCI. *(text modified on 1.01.18; 1.01.20, 1.01.21)*

The age of a rider shall be determined by the difference between the year of the event and the year of birth of the rider.

Note: in case of cancellation the entry fee will be refunded except for 10 euro to cover administrative costs

5. RACES PROCEDURES

Masters (Women and Men)

These categories are doing a seeding run - all riders will qualify for the final - but they must take **the start of** the seeding run;

The results of the seeding run determine the start order in the final, with the slowest rider from the seeding run starting first.

If a rider does not complete the Seeding Run (DNF), he/she will start as the first in his/her category (ahead of the slowest rider who finished the Seeding Run). If several riders from the same category do not finish the Seeding Run, they will start first in order of the Seeding Run start list (between them).

If a biker validly entered in the race does not take the start in the Seeding Run, he/she will be considered DNS and will not be allowed to participate in the Final Run.

Youth categories (Women and Men)

These categories are doing a seeding run - all riders will qualify for the final - but they must take **the start of** the seeding run;

The results of the seeding run determine the start order in the final, with the slowest rider from the seeding run starting first.

If a rider does not complete the Seeding Run (DNF), he/she will start as the first in his/her category (ahead of the slowest rider who finished the Seeding Run). If several riders from the same category do not finish the Seeding Run, they will start first in order of the Seeding Run start list (between them).

If a biker validly entered in the race does not take the start in the Seeding Run, he/she will be considered DNS and will not be allowed to participate in the Final Run.

Juniors and Elite (Women and Men)

These categories are doing a seeding run - all riders will qualify for the final - but they must take **the start of** the seeding run;

The results of the seeding run determine the start order in the final, with the slowest rider from the seeding run starting first.

If a rider does not complete the Seeding Run (DNF), he/she will start as the first in his/her category (ahead of the slowest rider who finished the Seeding Run). If several riders from the same category do not finish the Seeding Run, they will start first in order of the Seeding Run start list (between them).

If a biker validly entered in the race does not take the start in the Seeding Run, he/she will be considered DNS and will not be allowed to participate in the Final Run.

6. AWARDS CEREMONIES

In accordance with articles 1.2.112 and 1.2.113 of the UCI Regulations, the 3 best riders of each category must attend the official awards ceremony, any interviews organized and the press conference.

Unless otherwise stated, riders shall appear at official ceremonies wearing competition clothing. Riders must present themselves at the podium right after crossing the finish line.

7. POINTS SCALE

For 2024 UEC MTB Downhill European Championships, points will be attributed in accordance with the UCI MTB regulations, Annex 2.

8. AWARDS AND PRIZE MONEY

Jersey and medals

Every European Championship will be awarded with:

The 1st place:	European Champion jersey and Gold medal
The 2nd place:	Silver medal
The 3rd place:	Bronze medal

The prize money will be transferred by the UEC directly to the concerned National Federations by mid-November. Therefore, prize money should be requested to your National Federation in due time.

9. ANTIDOPING

The UCI antidoping regulations are entirely applicable to the event.

10. PENALTIES

The UCI penalty scale is the only one applicable.

11. RESPONSIBILITIES

The organiser and UEC will not, under any circumstances, be liable to any accidents or damage that occurs during training and competitions.

The organiser and UEC decline all responsibilities towards the riders and others in case of an accident.

For all cases not covered by these specific regulations, the UCI rules will apply. Any problems will be solved between the organizers, the Commissaires Panel and UEC officials.
