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1. INTRODUCTION

Sviland BMX is pleased to once again welcome riders to Sandnes and Velde Arena. 2. TRACK DETAILS

Velde Arena features two start hills and three double straights.

The Supercross track has an 8 m start hill, a pro section, and a rhythm section. The 5 m hill is equally steep and challenging, but lower than the SX start.

The track is known for its smooth flow and wide, open turns, creating excellent racing conditions. With 80% of the surface covered in bricks, the track is exceptionally fast.

The track has in 2026 been updated and rebuilt by DigTracks and is now considered more fun and challenging than ever.

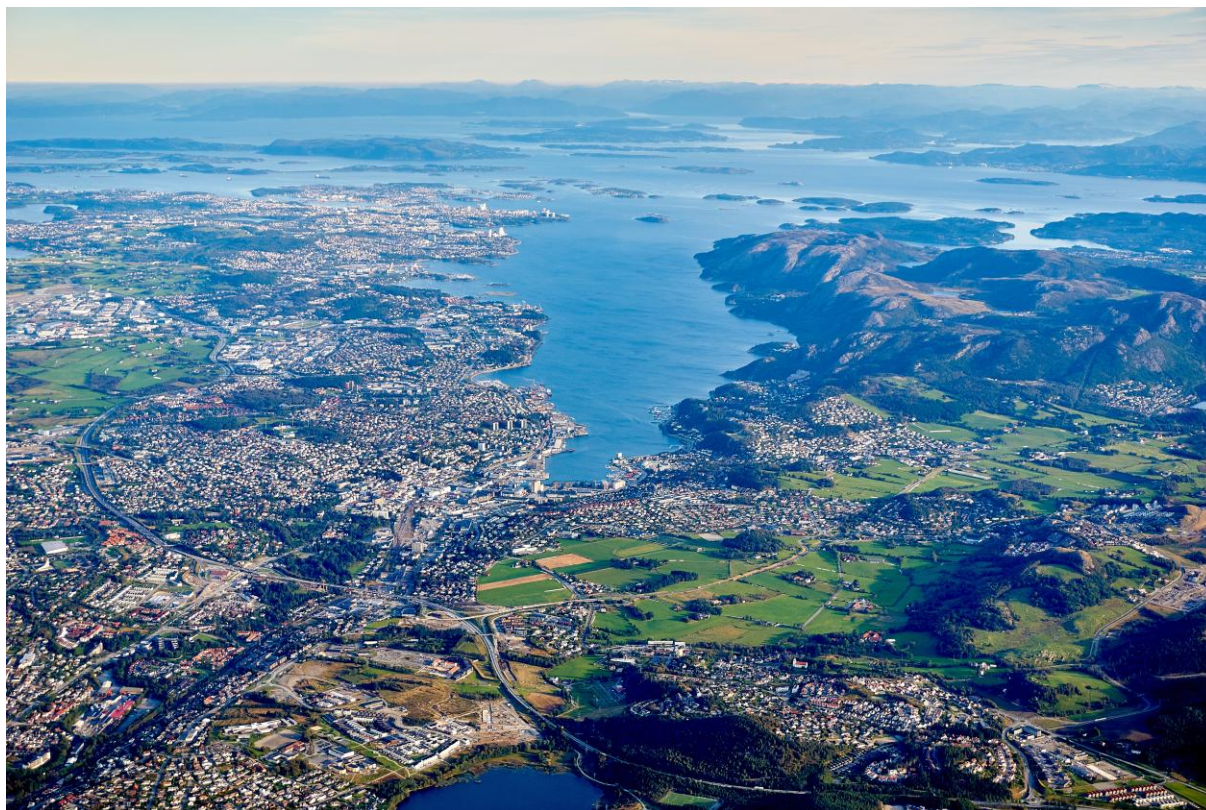


3. THE CITY OF SANDNES

Please be aware of Norwegian laws regarding kids in sports: [Children's right in Sport](#)
Children's sports are defined as sporting activities for children up to 12 years of age.

In Norway for competitions in children's sports, the following rules apply:

- a) Children may participate in local competitions and sporting events in the year they turn 6, and primarily in their own sports club.
- b) Children may participate in regional competitions and sporting events in the year they turn 9.
- c) Children may participate in open competitions and sporting events in Norway, the Nordic countries and the Barents region in the year they turn 11.
- d) Children from the Nordic countries and the Baltic region may participate in competitions and sporting events in Norway in the year they turn 11.
- e) Results lists, tables and rankings in competitions can be used for children in the year they turn 11, if appropriate.
- f) Children cannot participate in championships such as Norwegian Championships, European Championships, World Championships and equivalent competitions up to and including the year they turn 12.
- g) All children must receive prizes at sporting events if prizes are given.

9. REGISTRATION AND RIDER'S CONFIRMATION

The 2026 registration fees, excluding administration fee*, National Federation fee** and bank costs*** are the following:

- To register for UEC events you need an account using your UCI-ID.
- You can only register for an event by paying the applicable fees directly.
- *Administration fee depends on the agreements with the organiser.
- **If applicable, National Federation fee.
- ***Bank costs depend on your payment choice and will be charged directly.
- After registration you receive a confirmation e-mail from JSTiming.
- In this portal you can find the most current registration overview at the event under the 'Entries' button.
- Cancellation costs and administration/bank costs depend on the agreements with the organiser.
- After cancellation you receive an e-mail confirming your cancellation from JSTiming.
- Refund [if applicable] will follow the deadline for cancellations.

Late entries

Late entries are possible for all riders until deadline for late entries, paying double entry fee. The deadline for late entries can also be found on the event page in the registration portal.

Extra late entries

Extra late entries are possible for all riders until deadline for extra late entries, paying triple entry fee. The deadline for extra late entries can also be found on the event page in the registration portal.

Deadline cancellations

The deadline for cancellations can also be found on the event page in the registration portal. In case of a cancellation before the deadline, the entry fee will be refunded. Cancellation fee, administration fee and bank costs (per rider, per round) still must be paid. These fees will be deducted from the paid entry fees.

In case of a cancellation after the deadline, the entry fee will NOT be refunded.

Rider confirmation

All team managers and Chef d'Equipe must attend the rider confirmation on Friday at the Welcome centre to confirm their riders' participation for the event.

Transponders

All riders in Challenge 15/16 and Championships classes (Junior, U23 and Elite) require a UEC transponder to be able to participate. The transponders are provided by UEC. They will be provided in a bag per country to the Chef d'Equipe / team manager.

Immediately after the race, the transponders for each country must be handed in by the Chef d'Equipe / team manager after the race.

If a rider fails to return the transponder after the event, the UEC will send an invoice of €100.00 per transponder to the federation. The rider will not be able to participate in the next UEC BMX European Cup round until the invoice is paid.

Above apply both for all races of the UEC BMX European Cup.

10. RULES

The provisions of the latest version of the UCI's BMX Rulebook apply with a few amendments:

- Riders categories: as set forth in chapter 7.
- UEC BMX European Cup events are open to all riders who are licensed by a National Federation, with a minimum age of 8 years old. There is no limit in the number of riders a country can register.
- Event format Challenge categories: For all Challenge categories, excluded Boys 15/16 & Girls 15/16, scrambled seeding is used for the motos according to article 6.1.027quater of the UCI BMX Rulebook.
- The posting of race information including start lists and results will be done electronically at every event of the UEC BMX European Cup events.
- Number of motos: in case of special conditions (weather, wind or else) or a high number of participants, the UEC BMX Commission allows the PCP in agreement with the UEC Technical delegate to reduce the number of motos. This can only apply for challenge classes and never for championship classes.

Event format Challenge category Boys 15/16, Girls 15/16 and Championship categories:

- The UCI BMX World Cup system is used according to articles 6.3.009 till 6.3.014 of the latest version of the [UCI BMX Rulebook \(link to UCI website\)](#).
- Riders are not automatically entered in both Rounds of each UEC BMX European Cup event. Riders can opt to participate in only 1 Round during the UEC BMX European Cup event.
- All riders in Championships categories and Challenge 15/16 require a UEC transponder to participate in UEC BMX European Cup Rounds. The rider is responsible to have the assigned transponder always attached to the bike correctly during warmup, practice and racing.
- Seeding on day 1: the latest UCI individual ranking. seeding on day 2: the result of the first day. In case of a combined classes: first all the Elite ranked riders are seeded, second all the U23 ranked riders. The unranked riders follow randomly.
- Gate starting positions are decided as follows:
 - a. Round 1: With each heat, gate positions are chosen in the order in which the riders are seeded.
 - b. Last Chance: Within each heat, gate positions are chosen in order of the riders' lap time from Round 1 (fastest to slowest).
 - c. Qualifiers and Finals: In order of lap time (fastest to slowest) from the preceding phase or round.For the first round of the Qualifiers, the seeding order of the first round of the Qualifiers is used. Ties are broken by lap time from the phase or round before, until the tie is broken (up to and including seeding order in Round 1).

Rider's equipment:

- All Challenge riders (including 15/16 riders) must either wear a clearly visible national flag of their country on both shoulders or the national jersey of their country.
- All riders receive a number plate and side plate from UEC at registration of the UEC BMX European Cup Race. In all UEC sanctioned BMX events a rider must display the number plate and side plate assigned to him. A rider who fails to display the correct number plates will be refused their start, or relegated, if it is noticed after beginning a heat or run.
- The current leader in the UEC BMX European Cup is racing with a red leader plate. Only applicable for the categories Boys 15/16; Girls 15/16; Junior Men; Junior Women, Men U23; Women U23; Men Elite; Women Elite.
- If a Championship rider is National Champion in their class, this rider must wear either:
 - the jersey awarded by the federation,
 - a replica of that jersey with publicity in the spaces allowed by the regulations,
 - their normal jersey with the left sleeve designed to look like the flag of their country.

Team manager meeting

Team Managers meeting will be on Thursday, as indicated in the time schedule. The location of the meeting will be the Welcome Centre. The participation is mandatory for: max. 1 National Delegate (Chef d'Equipe); max. 1 Team Manager of the UEC registered team, max. 2 National BMX Coaches (registered by National federation). If necessary, the UEC Technical delegate and PCP can decide to call for other meetings during the event.

11. ACCREDITATION

Prior to each event, it is mandatory for every national federation to register their staff. Federations are required to submit the names and the roles of all staff members via email to j.polkamp@uec.ch in advance of the event. **Deadline: Monday before the event.**

A Chef d'Equipe or his nominated staff is accredited by the UEC with the right to enter a restricted zone to perform his duties. Such accreditation may be revoked for any breach of the UCI Regulations or noncompliance with the instructions of the organisation or the Commissaires' panel.

All athletes will be given a wristband so that they can reach all areas necessary.

National Teams

Prior to each event, it is mandatory for every national federation to register their National team staff (Championship coach, doctor, other staff members). Federations are required to submit the names and the roles of all staff members via email to j.polkamp@uec.ch in advance of the event.

Deadline: Monday before the event.

Chef d'Equipe

Each federation that pre-registers riders must appoint a Chef d'Equipe (national team manager) to represent the interests of all its riders. Each Chef d'Equipe must confirm the presence of each rider as per the pre-registration riders list at rider confirmation, as indicated in the timing schedule.

Mandatory registration of staff before the event

Prior to each event, it is mandatory for every national federation to register their appointed Chef d'Equipe as well as the entire team. Federations are required to submit the names of all staff members via email to j.polkamp@uec.ch in advance of the event.

Deadline: Monday before the event.

Chef d'Equipe, Team managers and assistants must present a license issued by the federation. The UEC will verify the registration details of all staff members before granting accreditation. Please note that accreditation will not be issued by the UEC in the absence of proper registration.

National BMX coaches

UEC acknowledges official BMX National coaches for European Cup. National federations can register their coaches. They will be provided with accreditation per race. A country can register max 2 coaches per country per race.

Personal BMX coaches for Championship riders

Championships riders who come to the event with a personal BMX coach are offered the possibility to buy a Coach accreditation. This accreditation (for Championships riders only) costs €150 per weekend. This allows you access to the team manager meeting and coach area. This coach accreditation can be bought from UEC at the Welcome Centre during rider confirmation.

12. UEC BMX EUROPEAN CUP TEAM RANKING & TEAM AREA**UEC Registered teams**

Prior to each event, UEC teams must confirm the participation of their four riders during the designated rider confirmation process, as outlined in the event schedule. After the first moto begins, the confirmed rider list cannot be changed or supplemented. These four designated riders will gain points for the UEC BMX Team ranking.

Once the four riders for the Team ranking have been confirmed, the team manager will receive accreditation for the event. Accreditation is granted exclusively to teams that enter the team competition. The UEC BMX team manager or an appointed assistant receives accreditation, providing access to the restricted areas required to fulfill their responsibilities.

Accreditation may be withdrawn if there is any violation of UEC or UCI regulations, or failure to comply with instructions from the organizers or the commissaires' panel.

For all rules concerning UEC BMX European Cup Team Ranking see European Cup Team Rules document on UEC website (www.uec.ch/en/bmx-european-cup).

Team parking

Each team/country that reserves a space in the team area will receive one (1) car pass for every team space booked from the organiser.

Location team parking: Next to team area

Team Spaces for UEC registered teams

Throughout the event, access to the team area is restricted exclusively to riders and accredited personnel. Wristbands will be provided for accreditation.

These Teams receive 1 passe partout bracelet and 1 car pass from the organizer per team tent space (6x3m).

UEC Teams must register team spaces as indicated in the event Technical Guide. The organiser will provide spaces for team tents to UEC registered teams, or 6 x 3 m for each team, at the cost of €150 per team space.

Team Spaces for other teams

The organiser can provide spaces for team tents to non-UEC registered teams, of 6 x 3 m for each team, at the cost of € 200,00. These Teams receive 1 passe partout bracelet and 1 car pass from the organizer per team tent space (6x3m).

Team area rules

- Throughout the event, access to the team area is restricted exclusively to riders and accredited personnel.
- Teams must leave + 1h after training/racing ends
- Team Tent area will be closed +1h hours after the races/practice end.
- The organizers will assign space locations.
- The organization is not responsible for any damaged or missing items.
- Rules loading / unloading of the team equipment: -1h before training/warmup starts

Prize money Championship classes

The prize money will be paid after the prize ceremony by bank transfer by the organiser. QR code will be provided for payment info.

Award ceremony

Only Championship riders who come in 1st to 3rd place are obligated to attend the award ceremony in race uniform.

UEC requires a clean podium photo without commercial attributes, like helmets, goggles or bikes, for media purposes. Afterwards riders may take photos with commercial items.

The prize money will be increased by 10% with more than 1.000 participants registered per round.

The prize money for the overall ranking of the 2026 UEC BMX European Cup will be paid to the riders by the UEC in accordance with the Competition rules as per enclosed breakdown. The UEC 2026 Overall ranking for Championships categories will take into consideration all rounds.

The 2026 Overall Ranking ceremony for all categories will be held after the award ceremony Round 12 in Zolder (Belgium). The overall prize money is paid to riders when at least 6 rounds of the UEC BMX European Cup have been organised.

The UEC will proceed payment by the end of November 2026 through the riders' National Cycling Federation.

2026 Overall Ranking Challenge Categories

The UEC 2026 Overall ranking will take into consideration all rounds.

The ranking of the 2026 BMX European Cup will be established for all Challenge categories 13 years and over. Categories 12 years and younger will not have an overall ranking. Riders participating in rounds 11 and 12 will earn double points towards the UEC BMX Overall ranking.

The 2026 Overall Ranking ceremony for all categories will be held after the award ceremony of Round 12 in Zolder (Belgium).

2026 Overall UEC BMX European Cup Teams Ranking

The UEC BMX European Cup Teams ranking will take into consideration all rounds. Riders participating in rounds 11 and 12 will earn double points towards the UEC BMX Overall Teams ranking. The overall UEC BMX European Cup Teams award ceremony will be held after Round 12 in Zolder (Belgium) with the Top 3 Team coaches and maximum 4 riders per team.

The UEC BMX Commission will award prize money to the 3 first teams at the end of 12 rounds. The overall prize money is paid to teams when at least 6 rounds of the UEC BMX European Cup have been organised.

22. PRESS

Press accreditation for the event may be granted only to accredited journalists in possession of an ID card issued by the national press association. Accreditation for the events must be done through the UEC website for all UEC events <http://uec.ch/en/media>.

During the UEC BMX European Cup events accreditation and BIB's will be handed out by UEC. It is mandatory to wear UEC press BIB's for the journalists on the track. The UEC will provide them and have someone responsible for their distribution.

The number of journalists on the track at the same time must be agreed by the PCP depending on the track space/size.

Press conferences, flash interviews etc. must be agreed with the UEC BMX Commission.

For all publications the UEC logo as well as the UEC main sponsor logo should be used in accordance with UEC graphic charter.

General rules

- At every UEC BMX event BIB's are used for press on and off the track.
- The distribution of the BIB at the events is done by the indicated UEC official.
- During the events, five red Bibs' (of which one for the UEC photographer) are distributed, the rest of the photographers get a yellow BIB.
- The BIB distribution is examined separately for Challenge and Championship classes
- A guarantee for each BIB is mandatory: € 20 or an official document (driver's license, identity card, press card ...)
- By failing to comply with the regulations or the instructions of officials, the BIB can be taken from a photographer immediately.
- Be careful when using flash. Do not flash directly into the eyes of the riders.
- Photographers must be impartial on the track; it is not allowed to cheer for a rider in the track.
- It is strictly forbidden to touch a rider and / or bicycle.
- It's forbidden to walk across the photo finish line. This can cause problems for the people of the photo finish cameras.
- A photographers meeting can be organized. This will be announced in advance in a timely manner.

Drones might be allowed after consultation with the UEC responsible, providing they are allowed by local laws. The pilot must hold a valid pilot license and there must be compliance with all regulations regarding the airline (flight plan etc.) Moreover, the minimum and the maximum height are fixed according to the regulations of the country. Failure to comply with all the proposed rules will be reported to the police.

23. MEDICAL INFORMATION

A team of doctors and paramedics will be present throughout practice and racing. The team will be based on the track and have use of a medical room at the bottom of the start ramp. The medical team will be available at the following times:
