

REGULATIONS

The UEC European Championships Cycle Ball Elite will be played in a final event

Date: One week before the UEC European Championships Juniors. The UEC European Championships Cycle Ball Elite can take place on one or two days, depending on the local conditions.

Participants: 2016 the three top-ranked nations of the last World Championships receive two starting places. From 2017 on the three top-ranked, nations of the last European Championships receive two starting places. The next three highest ranked European nations receive one starting place. The host receives a Wild Card. If a nation does not exploit its quota, the organizing nation may designate another team. Nations with two teams have to provide a UCI Commissaire.

Mode: Two preliminary round groups of five teams, sharing is done according to the last to the last European Championships result.

First - and second place will qualify for the half finals.

If two teams are equal on points for reaching the half finals, the direct match decides. In case of a draw a play-off match is played (art. 8.1.045). If more than, two teams are equal on points the results of games between these teams shall be considered. The two highest in this ranking shall play a play-off match under article 8.1.045. Should this match be drawn the result shall be determined by penalty kicks under paragraph 4.

The other teams have to play placement matches. In case of a draw, the result shall be determined by penalty kicks under paragraph 4.

For the order of play for the preliminary rounds, the UCI regulations apply.

The UEC -Commission creates the schedule.

Additional Remarks

Over and above that, the European Championships are played under the current UCI regulations Cycle Ball.

All teams have to wear their **national jerseys**, except the World Champion, World Cup Leader

or National Champions; the latter must bear the corresponding champion jerseys. Both players must have the same nationality.

The chief commissaire is responsible for matches, division commissaires, result sheets, etc.

The schedule will be done by UEC Commission.
